Notebook

A notebook will be used in class to answer questions from reading material and discussion. The notebook will be collected at the end of each week for a weekly grade worth 20 points.

Quiz

Quiz will be given each Thursday on the material covered that week. Each quiz will be worth 10 points.

Participation

Various skills are required to be demonstrated with 100% proficiency. Each skill will be taught and practiced in class. Then each student will be required to demonstrate the skill.
