1 Peter 4:12-5:14 - What attitude does Peter say we should have towards suffering? How is that different than your usual response?

Day 2: questions reflection

2 Peter 1:1-11 - What seven qualities does Peter tell us we should desire? Which are you doing the best at? Which do you need the most work on?

2 Peter 1:12-21 - How does Peter describe his relationship to the gospel story here? What does this passage have to say about the origin of prophecy?

Day 3: questions reflection

2 Peter 2:1-12 - What words does Peter use to describe false teachers in this passage? What does Peter say will happen to those who teach falsely?

2 Peter 2:13-22 -What does Peter say about those who escaped the world through Jesus only to go back to the world? Can a person loose their salvation?

Day 4: questions reflection

2 Peter 3:1-9 - Why is it so easy to wonder if God's promises will come true. What comment does Peter make about the timing of God's promise?

2 Peter 3:10-18 - What do you think of Peter's description of the coming of the "day of the Lord"? Does this give you comfort or make you nervous? Why?
